THIS QUANT NEW ENGLAND TOWN BRIMS WITH NATURE • HISTORY • CELEBRITY • ROMANCE • INTRIGUE

Every Stockbridge season is stamped with its own beauty and charm; the green and flower-filled lushness of spring and summer; a fall foliage palette without rival; the winter feel of an old-fashioned Christmas card. Enjoy a wide range of outdoor activities or take a deep breath, inhale the Berkshire mountain air, and slow your pace to match the town's character. Stroll our streets, pathways, and gardens. Indulge your senses in our beautiful rolling hills surroundings and perhaps catch a glimpse of one of our many wild, indigenous inhabitants.

Stockbridge is shaped by its rich history – from its origin as an Indian mission town, to its heyday as a summer home for wealthy families of the Gilded Age, to its current small-town atmosphere captured so endearingly by the American illustrator, Norman Rockwell.

Stockbridge

A WALKING TOUR (see map, pages 22-23)

We have mapped out a route that samples our history, culture, vistas, and leisurely shopping. Start at the town’s crossroads, Main and South Street (Rte. 7). The famed Red Lion Inn, originally founded as the Inn at the Sign of the Red Lion in 1773 (along with the sign of King George III), graces the corner. Its famous front porch beckons visitors to sit, sip, and people watch. Set in the triangular park at the center of the crossroads is one of Stockbridge’s public landmarks, the 1862 Cat and Dog Fountain.

A right turn from the crossroads leads you past many historic buildings. Norman Rockwell captured the interior of the 1884 House, the original Stockbridge Town Offices, in “The Marriage License.” Be sure to explore The Mews, a Main Street cul-de-sac of shops, and its neighboring byway that marks the spot of the original Alice’s Restaurant of Arlo Guthrie fame.

At the corner of Main and Elm stands the Stockbridge Library. One of the oldest libraries in Western Massachusetts, the original structure, now the left wing, was built in 1864. The library houses the Historical Room, a museum and research center containing the original Hitty doll and artifacts from the town’s earliest inhabitants, the Mahican Indians.

The 1881 Watering Trough stands at the corner of Main and Elm. It features the homilies “Utility is preferable to grandeur” and “Merciful man is kind to his beast.” As you walk down Elm Street, you’ll notice the 1862 red and white

firehouse known as Hose House No.1 that Rockwell pictured in his work “The New American LaFrance is here!” The impressive 1862 St. Joseph’s Church is at the left corner.

Turn the corner onto Maple Street, take a right onto South Street, passing The Red Lion Inn, and cross Main. You will be on Pine Street at the site of the 1866 Soldiers Monument. At that corner, the 1884 St. Paul’s Episcopal Church features a chancel window by LaFarge, baptistry by Louis St. Gaudens, and nave window by Tiffany.

Go west on Main Street, toward the beautiful “Cottages” built by wealthy industrialists as summer mansions during the opulent Gilded Age.

The corner of Main and Sergeant Street presents you with The Mission House museum, built in 1739 (the year Stockbridge was incorporated) by Rev. John Sergeant, the first missionary to the Mahican Indians. Originally located on Eden Hill, the Mission House was moved to its Main Street site in the 1920s, restored, furnished with authentic period pieces, and opened as a museum in 1930. Continuing West on Main you will discover the historic Stockbridge Cemetery with its Sedgwick Pie, the ancestral plot of one of Stockbridge’s oldest families.

Cross Main Street to the 19th century Village Green, site of the 1824 Congregational Church, with membership dating back to 1739; additional war

memorials, and the Children’s Chime Tower, dedicated in 1878 and rung at 5:30 every evening from “apple blossom time until frost” in accordance with the donor’s wishes. The historic Greek Revival building is the Historic Town Hall currently vacant. Farther west on Main Street, past the Congregational Church is the Indian burial ground monument, with its obelisk of stone hewn from the nearby Ice Glen.

The following special sites are best reached by car, although the hearty may wish to walk or bicycle.

SOUTH A few blocks south of Main discover the Ice Glen, a natural wonder ideal for hiking. Take Rte. 7 South; turn left onto Park Street and park at the end of the street. A footbridge over the Housatonic River will lead you to three trails. The Mary Flynn trail is a paved walk along the river that is handicapped accessible. Or cross the railroad track. In a quarter of a mile, the right fork will lead you into the Ice Glen complete with glacial boulders and ice crystals even in July. The left fork will take you to Laura’s Tower. Climb the tower for views of Mt. Everett, the Catskills, and the Green Mountains.

EAST Traveling east from The Red Lion Inn, you’ll come to the Town Offices, Police Station and Stockbridge Chamber of Commerce. It also houses public restrooms. Across the street and a little farther to the East, you will find The Fitzpatrick Main Stage. Originally built as a casino in 1888, this iconic building, designed by Stanford White, helped establish the Berkshires as a cultural destination when it became home to the Berkshire Theatre Festival, founded in 1928. It remains the main stage for the summer festival of plays.

NORTH At the Stockbridge crossroads, go north on Pine Street; The Marian Fathers’ property, Eden Hill, is at the top of the hill. It’s the home of the National Shrine of The Divine Mercy, the Association of Marian Helpers, and the National Shrine Gift Shop. Veer left from Pine Street up Prospect Hill for a glimpse of grand “cottages” and farmsteads. Naumkeag, designed by Stanford White, is one of a few Berkshire Cottages open to the public. Built in 1885 for Joseph Choate, a prominent New York attorney and ambassador to Great Britain, the home, furnishings, and lush gardens draw the visitor into the Gilded Age. The Trustees of Reservations, established in 1891 as the country’s first independent organization for the preservation of landscape and historic sites, oversee Naumkeag, the Mission House, and Monument Mountain.

As you continue to climb up Prospect Hill, you pass Hawthorne Cottage (The Little Red House), home of Nathaniel Hawthorne from 1850–51. Here he collected material for Tanglewood Tales and The Wonder Book, wrote The House of Seven Gables, and crafted names that were later used by two famous sites — Shadowbrook, the largest of the Berkshire Cottages (now the site of Kripalu), and Tanglewood, the summer home of the Boston Symphony Orchestra.

WEST Travel west from the town of Stockbridge, turn right at the cemetery, follow Rte. 102 (Church St.) to the Berkshire Botanical Garden. Fifteen acres of landscaped gardens, woodland walks, and picnicking offer visitors information and inspiration.

At the intersection (Rtes. 183 & 102) go north on Rte. 183 one mile to Berkshire Art Center, a nonprofit community center housed in historic Citizens’ Hall, a 1872 High Empire Victorian building.

As you travel back south on Rte. 183, signs will direct you to the Norman Rockwell Museum. Home of the world’s largest collection of original Rockwell paintings, the museum includes the artist’s studio, outdoor sculpture by Rockwell’s son Peter, scenic trails and picnic areas, the Museum Store, and a seasonal terrace café. The museum features permanent and changing exhibitions of Norman Rockwell and American Illustration Art; and offers tours, programs, and classes.

Continue south onto Rte. 183 and follow the signs to Chesterwood, the summer estate of sculptor Daniel Chester French (1850–1931). The Colonial Revival residence and studio house nearly 500 pieces of sculpture — one of the largest collections of fine art devoted to a single American sculptor and period. French is best known for creating two of our nation’s most powerful symbols: The Minute Man (1875), and Abraham Lincoln (1922) for the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, DC.

WEST STOCKBRIDGE Travel west from the town of Stockbridge, turn right at the cemetery onto Rte. 102 (Church St.) and follow the winding country road for approximately 4.4 miles into the center of historical West Stockbridge.

A tranquil and fertile valley fed by the Williams River, West Stockbridge, was incorporated in 1774. Close to NY and boasting a rich history in mining marble, iron, and lime, this lovely little town, once home to more than 30 quarries, was the first railroad terminus in Berkshire County.

Today, West Stockbridge retains its picturesque, small town character. It is home to about 1,600 full-time residents in addition to local businesses, restaurants, outdoor sculpture park, and seasonal farmer’s market.





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What to See & Do

The Stockbridge area is blessed with a line-up of cultural attractions which rival that of many metropolitan areas: internationally renowned summer festivals of music, theatre, and dance; major art museums and galleries, historic homes, gardens, and sculpture parks.

The spectacular Berkshire countryside which provides a backdrop for the cultural showcase is itself a destination, offering opportunities for camping as well as numerous trails and back roads for hiking, cycling, bird watching, cross country skiing, and snowshoeing.

Stockbridge Trails

LAUREL HILL ASSOCIATION TRAILS

Within walking distance of downtown Stockbridge, located at the end of Park Street.

Ice Glen Trail is a 1 mile (round trip) climb over, under, and around giant boulders in a glacial ravine. The sides of the glen are covered with old stand pine and hemlock while the south end is reputedly home to the tallest pine in Massachusetts.

Laura's Tower Trail is a quiet 1.5 mile (round trip) wooded ascent, starting out through old stand pine and hemlock. A metal tower at the summit provides a panoramic view of the middle Berkshires, including Mount Greylock to the north, the highest point in Massachusetts.

Mary V. Flynn Trail is an easy 1.2 mile (round-trip) walk in the woods and along the Housatonic River, on a wide, packed-gravel trail, built mostly on the bed of the old Berkshire Street Railway trolley line. Starting with a 100 foot boardwalk, the trail goes through birch, pine, cottonwood and invasive euonymus.

Bowker's Woods is divided into two sections. The upper trail is located across the entrance to Norman Rockwell Museum on Route 183 and is an old, indistinct trail that goes northwest from the pond. It extended over to Mohawk Lake Road, but crosses one of the sold parcels and is now private property. The lower trail, located about a mile outside downtown Stockbridge on Glendale Middle Road, is a mile plus loop that offers pleasant views and a cool calming atmospheres.

BULLARD WOODS is located at the intersection of Hawthorne Road and Hawthorne Street, across from the Linde Center in Stockbridge. Bullard Woods, a conservation property owned by the Stockbridge Bowl Association, is 42 acres, open to the public with 1.25 miles of hiking trails that begin at the parking lot at Hawthorne Road and lead to the shoreline.

GOULD MEADOWS, a conservation property owned by the Town of Stockbridge, located at 110B Interlaken Road is 95 acres, open to the public with .6 miles of public trails offering a nice walk to Stockbridge Bowl, open field and benches for relaxing.

Additional Berkshire Trails

APPALACHIAN TRAIL, located at 30 Rockwell Road in Lanesborough, provides hiking for both the long-distance or day hiker, traveling over Mount Everett in the south, all the way up and through Mount Greylock in the north.

ASHWILLTICOOK RAIL TRAIL, with trail heads located in Lanesborough and Adams, is an 11-mile rail-trail for walking, biking, skating, and

cross-country skiing. The trail passes through the Hoosic River Valley.

BASH BISH FALLS STATE PARK, located next to the Mount Washington State Forest, is about 60 feet and is one of Massachusetts' highest single-drop waterfalls. An easy hike with incredible views.

BEARTOWN STATE FOREST TRAIL, located at 69 Blue Hill Road in Monterey, is a 12,000 acre forest with a 1.5 mile loop around Benedict Pond. Stroll, hike, swim, boat, fish, ice skate, cross-country ski, or go snowmobiling.

BERKSHIRE NATURAL RESOURCE COUNCIL offers a wide variety of hiking and walking trails for all levels. Please visit bnrc.org for full information and regulations.

KENNEDY PARK, located at 91 Pittsfield Road in Lenox, is a town-owned and maintained hardwood forest whose groomed trails snake their way through 502 acres of tree lined forest. You can stroll, hike, mountain bike, horseback ride, even cross country ski and snowshoe in the winter.

MONUMENT MOUNTAIN, located along Rte 7 in Great Barrington, is popular among Berkshire adventurers. Enjoy expansive views of Beartown State Forest and Taconic Range from the summit.

MOUNT GREYLOCK, located at 30 Rockwell Road in Lanesborough, has a summit of 3,491 feet and is the highest point in Massachusetts, offering 50 miles of trails crisscrossing the mountain. From the summit, you can see as far as 90 miles on a clear day, including parts of four states and five mountain ranges. Hike or drive to the top for amazing views of the region.

OCTOBER MOUNTAIN, located at 317 Woodland Road in Lee, borders the towns of Washington, Becket, Lee and Lenox, and is the largest state forest in Massachusetts with 16,500 acres. Forest trails are available for hiking, mountain biking, cross-country skiing, and off-road vehicle use.

OLIVIA'S OVERLOOK TRAIL, located at 1289 Richmond Mountain Road in West Stockbridge, offers a beautiful vista and is the trailhead for more than 6 miles of hiking trails.

PLEASANT VALLEY WILDLIFE SANCTUARY, located at 472 West Mountain Road in Lenox, is a Mass Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary offering 1,000 lush acres of varied trails winding through forests, meadows, wetlands, and along the slopes of Lenox Mountain.

Scenic Drives

THE MOHAWK TRAIL, WILLIAMSTOWN TO WESTMINSTER • (Route 2) Begin in Williamstown, just 9 miles east of the best vista around, the Hairpin Turn at the Clarksburg/North Adams line with views of Adams, North Adams, Clarksburg and Williamstown. (If you haven't already visited, drive up Mount Greylock on your way by.) Hop out briefly at the Hoosac Range trailhead about a mile past the Hairpin Turn and take a quick walk to Sunset Rock, looking down on North Adams. Don't worry, it's certainly not the only spectacular view along the almost 70-mile byway. Follow the Deerfield River from Charlemont to Shelburne, and when you get

to Greenfield, stop and explore Rocky Mountain Park along the Connecticut River. From Westminister, check out Wachusett Mountain State Reservation for 360-degree views from this 2,006-foot peak.

JACOB'S LADDER SCENIC BYWAY • (Route 20) From the rocky heights of Mt. Tekoa in Russell to the Lee/Lenox town line, The Jacob's Ladder Scenic Byway is 35 miles through Russell, Huntington, Chester, Becket and Lee. It has the distinction of being the first mountain crossing built by the state for automobiles. October Mountain State Forest and Chester-Blandford State Forest are convenient stops to add to your day. Another highlight along this byway are the Keystone Arches, stone railroad bridges built around 1840 without mortar or steel reinforcements. A 2.5-mile trail offers a chance to hike and see the bridges up close.

MOUNT GREYLOCK SCENIC BYWAY • From Lanesborough to North Adams (Rockwell Road, North Adams Road, Notch Road), there's more to Mount Greylock than just the peak! Take this short,

16-mile drive from Lanesborough to North Adams, perfect for catching some foliage if you can't make a day of it. And if you've got the time, don't miss out on the 70 miles of hiking trails available in the reservation. Be aware, during peak season, the road to Mount Greylock can be congested, and foot traffic can be heavy at the summit.

Pick Your Own

WINDY HILL FARM • Great Barrington, MA—Pick your own apples and blueberries on the scenic hillside of this beloved family farm. The apple season begins around late August with tart, crunchy Paulared and Ginger Gold varieties. Typically there are over 25 varieties to follow, including several heirlooms. Take home fresh-pressed, all-natural unpasteurized sweet cider. The blueberry season usually begins around early July. In the winter holiday season find holiday garland, cut trees, and decorations.

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Where to Stay

When Norman Rockwell described Stockbridge as “...the Best of New England,” he may have been influenced by the town’s architectural landscape, as well as its tradition of extending hospitality to visitors. Today the town’s innkeepers help preserve Stockbridge’s historic character and maintain its heritage of welcoming guests, while providing the modern amenities travelers have come to expect.

Whether you prefer an historic inn, charming B&B or a newer property, be sure to make your reservations well in advance if you’re planning to visit during the popular summer or fall foliage seasons.

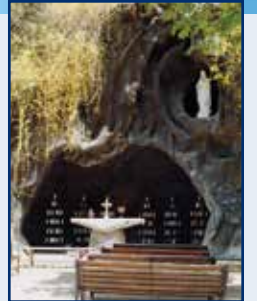
